

## YOETZ/ET (PARENT LIAISON & CAMPER CARE SPECIALIST) JOB DESCRIPTION

(Updated 10/2022)

The Yoetz/et (Parent Liaison & Camper Care Specialist) is part of the senior leadership team and is responsible for the care and individual needs of campers and staff in an *edah* (division). The individual must develop a strong, positive relationship with the camp leadership, counselors, other staff members, campers and parents.

## **Qualifications:**

- Dedication to the Camp Ramah mission and vision.
- Educational experience in social work, psychology, education, or child development undergraduate degree required.
- Experience working with children ages 5-11 in an educational or recreational setting.
- Maturity and professionalism: must be able to work effectively with other staff, address camper social and emotional needs discretely, and maintain confidentiality in work with campers, staff, and parents.
- Strong oral and communication skills: must be able to communicate efficiently with staff and parents, as well as maintain proper documentation.
- High-level organizational skills.
- Flexibility: must be a team-player and address problems as they arise.

## Primary responsibilities include:

- 1. Work with Camp Director to ensure every child within the camp community is happy, healthy, safe, and successful at camp. This also includes working with our Assistant Director, nurse, and *Tikvah* (Inclusion) Director to ensure follow-up of individualized camper needs.
- 2. Liaison with parents to communicate specific camper concerns and updates with families. Some of this work may need to occur in the evenings or on a Sunday.

- 3. Mentor *Rosh Edah* (Unit Head) to help problem solve and strategize issues and concerns with campers and/or staff.
- 4. Support general operations and camp programming.
- 5. Partner with Summer Leadership Team, including Camp Directors, Roshei Edot, Tikvah Director, Camp Nurse, and Specialists.
- 6. Review camper files prior to the start of camp, which may include contacting some families before camp begins.
- 7. Work with staff during training week to develop a plan to carry out camper needs.
